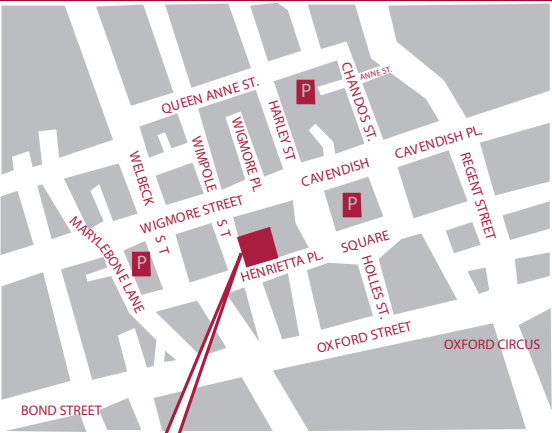

Message from the President

Welcome to the History of Medicine Society’s programme for 2019-2020. Following a very distinguished group of predecessors as President of this Society, and particularly the special year of Dr. Anjna Harrar, I hope to promote historical research in bridging gaps between the past, present, and future with an eye to the anniversaries of wartime events in British History. The year 2019 begins with an evening of conflict maritime medicine with Professor Robert Mason on the injuries and illnesses of Lord Horatio Nelson, and Dr. Pieter van der Merwe on ‘Fatal voyage: the surgeons on the Bounty 1787-90’. Our December evening looks at medicine, dentistry, and science in the 19th century, with Professor Jenny Gallagher discussing ‘Dr. Frederick Newland-Pedley: Boers, wars, Guys and the RADC’ and Mr. Pankaj Chandak on ‘Lister, Hunter and their influence on modern day surgery and science’.

Reflecting the 80th anniversary of the beginning of the 2nd World War, we have two talks on the influence of Winston Churchill’s illnesses on his ability to continue to fulfil his leadership. Professor Allister Vale will talk on ‘The illnesses of Sir Winston Churchill’ and Dr. John Scadding will discuss ‘The strokes of Sir Winston Churchill and their impact’.

In the spring of 2020, (April 1st) the Society will award the Norah Schuster prize to students demonstrating outstanding contributions to the history of medicine. You will also be able to enjoy Professor Marguerite Dupree giving the Bynum lecture on ‘Medical lives in the age of surgical revolution’. The academic year concludes with the Presidential Address on ‘Quays, Gulls and Guys 1725 to 2015’, reflecting a historical search and exploration beginning with a single line in the ‘East Coast Rivers Pilot’. This will be followed by the reconstituted Joint RSM-HoMS-Hunterian Society John Hunter Lecture on ‘Prostate surgery from Hunter to the present time: from lithotomy to robotics’ by Mr Ben Challacombe.

I am indebted to our recent past president, Dr. Anjna Harrar, whose enthusiasm for the History of Medicine is so infectious it could be classified as a medical condition, and Andrew Sadler for his guidance. I thank the committee of the Society, the library and all those who work at the RSM. Finally, I would like to convey my appreciation to the members who support and attend the meetings who make it all worthwhile.

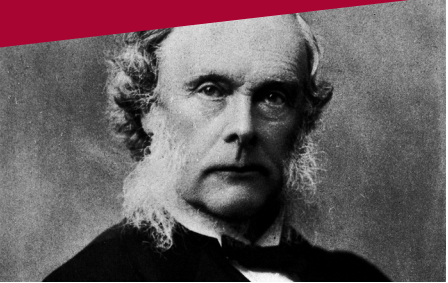
