In 2020, we commemorate the 150th anniversary of Charles Dickens's death from apoplexy in 1870.

Nicholas Cambridge has researched over 14,000 of Dickens's letters which provide us with a valuable insight into Dickens's many health problems. They also show that Dickens had a broad knowledge of medicine as well as knowing many doctors. Dickens was a social reformer through his novels, magazines – Household Words and All the Year Round - and speeches on social injustice.
